April 20. 7 PM. (Note special starting time). Program. Gerry Emmerich, FPSA. The Third Image-National Parks. Gerry is currently PSA Conventions Vice President and a member of the Board of Directors of PSA. He has been active in many important activities of PSA, including those dedicated to encouraging youth to become active photographers, and, of course, he is a key to the locations of PSA International Conferences. He has had outstanding achievements in the following divisions of PSA: Color Slide, Nature, Photojournalism, and Photo Travel. He competes widely in international competitions, with approximately 2700 acceptances, 75 medals and 9 Best of Show awards. A few of Gerry's most recent images can be found in the September PSA Journal on pp. 26-28.

Gerry's show is in two parts, running a total of about 75 minutes. The first half-hour will be a live narration slide presentation describing the conditions under which the photos in Part II were taken. Part II will present a series of short dissolve shows for each of several parts and is set to music. It includes approximately 300 slides. The Parks that will appear in this show include not only several USA parks, but also some from Canada. These parks are the following: Acadia NP; the Canadian Rockies – Banff and Jasper NP's; Great Sand Dunes NM; Colorado Rockies (including Rocky Mountain NP, Garden of the Gods Park in Colorado Springs, and the Air Force Academy Chapel); Yosemite NP;

Everglades NP and Ding Darling NWR; Death Valley NP; Yellowstone/Grand Teton NP's; and Volcanoes NP.

Coming just before our own Salon and the I-74 Challenge, Gerry Emmerich's show will be a great finale for our programs for this year. It must not be missed. We are indeed very fortunate that Gerry has agreed to detour on a trip to Oklahoma City for a PSA Board meeting to spend some time with us.

It is the intent of the joint club Challenge Committee that we also have a print competition in Reflections this year.

News from the CICCA Fall Salon and Annual Meeting.

The CICCA Fall Salon was held October 29 and 30 in Normal Illinois. Mary Cattell won the Medallion in Large Monochrome Prints with her print Country Club Snowscape. Other prints submitted by the Club that won honors or acceptances were Cigarette Break, Honors, by Andrew Leakey in Small Monochrome; four prints by Barry Brehm, all accepted in Small Color: Birchwood Forest, Late Fall Lane, Sunrise Silhouette,

and Connected; three prints in Small Color, all accepted, by Andrew Leakey: Big Ben, Tazmanian Crab, and Sunflower Field; Solitude, by Martha Schumann, accepted in Small Commercial; and in Large Commercial, Mary Cattell's two prints Santa Cruz Kayak #1 and Minn. Skyscraper Reflections both received Honors.

In the slide competition, the Club had one honors slide: In the Pictorial Category, Pink Flower, by Ben Hutagaol. In addition, the following slides were accepted: In the Nature Category, two slides by Barry Brehm: Morning Symphony and Gibbon Falls Detail. In Pictorial, Snowscape #2, by Barry Brehm; Boston Church Reflection and Stained Glass Daisy, both by Mary Cattell; What's in Here, by Harold Diamond; Glass Shop, by Aaron Gresch; and Toronto Building Interior, by Hiram Paley. In Contemporary, Hiram Paley's slide Inside the Bean was accepted.

Other CICCA News: CCCC President Hiram Paley received a **Top Rep** award (one of two reps to win this award). A certificate is given to each rep who essentially does his or her job. Also, Hiram was elected **President** of CICCA for the term beginning at the end of the 2004 Fall Salon through the end of the 2005 Fall Salon, with the expectation that he will serve a second year immediately following the first year. Further, it was announced that our Club will host the Fall, 2005, CICCA Salon on Friday, November 4 and Saturday, November 5. This event will be held at the Park Inn on Cunningham Avenue and will occur a few days before our Club's 70th Birthday. It will be CICCA's 55th Fall Salon. You are urged to mark these dates now and to participate in this Salon. As host Club, we will need some help getting things together and hope that many members will volunteer to help make this Salon a very successful one.
